<b>Able Charitable Trust (Southern Family Support)</b>	\$25,000.00	Funding to establish a new role for a Peer Support Advocate to assist clients impacted by mental distress/addiction to navigate Mental Health services and ancillary services in the community.	Otago
<b>Ako Hiko Education Trust</b>	\$25,000.00	Funding to provide approximately 50 Chromebook Bundles to families that could not otherwise afford them. They support education achievement in seven low decile schools located in the Mt Roskill, Mt Albert, Owairaka and New Windsor areas of Auckland.	Auckland
<b>Big Brothers Big Sisters of Hawkes Bay</b>	\$12,000.00	Funding towards Programme Manager and/or Mentor Coordinator costs. <b>Counselling Services Centre</b>	\$15,000.00	Funding towards the cost of providing one-hour sessions with a counsellor specialising in providing support for emotionally vulnerable clients who have experienced sexual violence, family harm and/or other emotional trauma.	Auckland
<b>Delta Community Support Trust</b>	\$16,863.00	Funding towards a Budget Advice and Advocacy Programme. The aim is to help people from marginalised and low-income backgrounds to improve their financial literacy, gain confidence, and become more competent with handling their finances.	Canterbury
<b>Family Drug Support Aotearoa New Zealand</b>	\$20,000.00	Funding towards the 5-Step Programme Delivery which assists families and friends to deal with alcohol and drug misuse that strengthens relationships and achieves positive outcomes.	Otago
<b>Glass Ceiling Arts Collective Limited</b>	\$9,980.00	Funding towards the Smoky Mirrors cabaret show for school-leavers with disabilities to come together and perform. This initiative provides access to learning opportunities that prepare marginalised young adults for meaningful work, contributing to positive impacts on health and wellbeing and a higher quality of life. <b>Grief Support Services Incorporated</b>	\$25,000.00	Funding for the provision of counselling sessions for adults, young people, children from age 6 and family/whanau. A specialist child counsellor is available to work with children and parents.	Bay of Plenty
<b>Hornby Presbyterian Community Trust</b>	\$20,000.00	Funding to provide subsidised counselling services to individuals, families and children that could not otherwise afford it.	Canterbury
<b>iSpeak Trust Board</b>	\$5,400.00	Funding towards the Auckland Project "Launching Pad Speaking Skills". This will involve 6 x 4-hour workshops in Auckland Secondary Schools. 20 students will attend each workshop. The aim is to inspire young people to develop their speaking skills to increase their self-confidence and self-belief.	Auckland
<b>Kenzie's Gift</b>	\$24,840.00	Funding for the Telehealth Triage Practitioner, a mental health professional that assesses clients and refers them for appropriate assistance. Services are provided to improve the well-being and mental health of children, young people and their families affected by cancer, serious illness, or family bereavement.	Auckland
<b>Life Education Trust North Shore</b>	\$9,999.00	Funding towards the costs the Healthy Harold programme for 1,500 North Shore students which will allow them to receive 2-3 health lessons (approximately 3 hours in total).	Auckland

<b>Mobility Assistance Dogs Trust</b>	\$25,000.00	Funding towards the salary costs of the Client Coordinator and Canine Senior Trainer. These two positions are essential to ensure the ongoing training and partnering of mobility dogs with individuals who are living with a physical disability.	Auckland
<b>Nelson Environment Centre Incorporated</b>	\$9,875.00	Funding towards a part-time project coordinator (for 6 months) for the Hapori Fruit & Veg Box initiative, a community food cooperative that provides affordable access to healthy, fresh produce for the community.	Nelson
<b>Nourish Trust</b>	\$9,000.00	Funding towards the purchase of food for Christmas hampers for 60 families in the Wellington region who are struggling at Christmas.	Wellington
<b>Orokonui Ecosanctuary Limited</b>	\$10,480.00	Funding to develop an educational programme focused on Tieke (South Island Saddleback) conservation (an interactive Tieke experience and take-home resources) that will be delivered to schools near the sanctuary.	Otago
<b>Outwest Youth Community Trust</b>	\$5,000.00	Funding towards driver trainer fees for three 3-day Learner Licence courses, giving 100 youth the opportunity to begin their driver licence and path to independence.	Auckland
<b>Penina Trust</b>	\$15,000.00	Funding towards the Consumer Day Programme, an initiative created to assist with the reintegration of Maori and Pasifika Mental Health clients into the South Auckland community. The objective of the programme is to build confidence, mental well-being and financial capability for mental health clients.	Auckland

<b>Project Esther Trust</b>	\$6,500.00	Funding to subsidise counselling sessions and to purchase personal care products for women and their families in a community facing adversity. Post the first Covid-19 lockdown, there has been an increase in the number of families seeking assistance with food parcels, personal and sanitary items as well as an increase in women and tamariki needing to access affordable counselling.	Canterbury
<b>RAW 2014 Limited</b>	\$9,500.00	Funding towards helping women offenders to reintegrate back into the community with lifestyle learning, community participation and contribution. This is achieved through cooking weekly meals, which feeds community families, growing and looking after vegetable gardens, learning to cook seasonally and gifting excess produce to the community.	Waikato
<b>RESPECT TRUST</b>	\$7,553.00	Funding for 15 counsellors to attend supervision once a month for 3 months and to provide a one-day St Johns first-aid training course so all staff and contractors can be first aid trained. These counsellors engage with people that have been impacted by family violence.	Auckland
<b>Talk Link Trust</b>	\$20,000.00	Funding towards the salaries of Clinicians who assist disabled people with communication disabilities in New Zealand to achieve greater levels of independence, socialisation and well-being.	Auckland
<b>Tamaki Community Development Trust</b>	\$15,000.00	Funding for a Mentoring programme working with at risk boys from 6 - 14 years old. These boys are at risk of being excluded from school. Mentoring is provided to the boys, as well as parenting support, enabling families to be self-determining and aspirational.	Auckland

<b>Tauranga Living Without Violence Collective Trust</b>	\$9,900.00	Funding for their new initiative - developing a youth specific programme for young people who have witnessed and/or experience family violence. The programme also provides content that addresses harmful behaviours.	Bay of Plenty
<b>Te Karanga Charitable Trust</b>	\$24,960.00	Funding towards their mentoring service for marginalised and vulnerable young people who have been adversely affected by the Covid-19 pandemic, inequality and social inequity.	Auckland
<b>Te Whakaora Tangata</b>	\$25,000.00	Funding for the Service Delivery Manager, whose work with high-risk whanau helps break inter-generational cycles of dysfunction. This position leads the frontline Services team in South Auckland; it facilitates courses & workshops, conducts counselling sessions & builds community partnerships.	Auckland
<b>The Clutha Budget Advisory Service</b>	\$7,922.00	Funding for the Focus on Finances project which involves working with foodbank users giving out budgeting tips with food parcels. 10 regular foodbank users will be invited to work with a Financial Mentor for a set period with incentives provided (\$20 grocery voucher at end of each session).	Otago
<b>The Friendship House Trust</b>	\$15,000.00	Funding towards the Social Practice Team in the support of women and girls from disadvantaged communities in Counties Manukau who come to Friendship House for help with violence, safety and abuse issues.	Auckland
<b>The Mary Potter Hospice Foundation</b>	\$25,000.00	Funding towards the salary of the Clinical Nurse Specialist who provides specialist nursing and palliative care support to patients who have chosen to end their life at home.	Wellington

<b>Waikato Family Centre Trust</b>	\$9,900.00	Funding to meet the increased demand for their service and programmes, particularly with Perinatal Mental Health. This includes Wellness programmes to meet clients' needs such as Pilates, yoga, pelvic floor and a six-week Mindfulness programme with a Counsellor.	Waikato
<b>Whakatipu Wildlife Trust</b>	\$6,400.00	Funding to retrofit counters to A24 traps designed to catch mustelids and rats. They are powered by a small gas canister and a Bluetooth counter is now available to add to the trap to keep track of how many times the trap has fired. This ensures the canisters are replaced at the correct time which avoids wasting gas.	Otago
<b>Who Did You Help Today Trust</b>	\$19,400.00	Funding for end-of-year activity packs to go to tamariki at their Homework Club schools across the country. These packs enable children to continue their learning at home during the summer holidays and share the packs with their family to encourage Whānau time.	Wellington
<b>Wild Side Charitable Trust</b>	\$9,218.00	Funding for kitchen appliances to meet the council consent requirements, as facilities are currently stretched to the limit catering for the Arapohue Retreat community. Arapohue Retreat was established to help the addicted and traumatised in the Kaipara and Northland.	Northland
<b>Wild Whiskers Tauranga</b>	\$6,000.00	Funding for vet costs, relating to rescuing stray and wild cats, to cover desexing, microchipping, sickness or injury and vaccinations. This will allow the cats to be adopted.	Bay of Plenty

<b>Wingspan Birds of Prey Trust</b>	\$6,580.00	Funding for Forensic Conservation in Action, two dissection workshops. Roughage consumed by birds of prey is regurgitated in the form of a pellet. These can be collected, dissected, and compared which allows analysis of what the bird has been eating and further understanding of the diets of various raptor species. This research will help restore New Zealand's birds of prey and secure their long-term future.	Bay of Plenty
<b>Woven Earth (Trust)</b>	\$9,500.00	Funding towards the costs of collecting donated furniture and delivering furniture and household items to the homes of women and children restarting their lives after fleeing domestic violence.	Auckland
<b>Youth in Transition Charitable Trust</b>	\$9,500.00	Funding for specialist youth counsellors for the delivery of the 'Journey Back to Awesome' programme. This is an innovative and holistic suicide prevention programme (offered at no cost).	Auckland
<b>Youthline Auckland Charitable Trust</b>	\$12,000.00	Funding towards the cost of training 100 new volunteers for the Youthline crisis, early intervention Helpline in support of the rangatahi of New Zealand. New volunteers undertake a 5-stage comprehensive training programme in their first year.	Auckland
<b>Zeal Education Trust</b>	\$4,440.00	Funding for 6 barista programmes, teaching approximately 25 young people industry-standard coffee & customer service skills to gain first-time employment.	Wellington
