Over 400 volunteers are involved in pest control programmes, monitoring 47km pest-proof fence, manage aviary and bird feeding, assist with guided walks, meet and greet programmes, administration, clear tracks, undertake and assist with research, grow plants, assist with management of the visitor centre and retail area. Museum of Transport and Technology Board	\$17,580.00	Funding for 10 computers and 10 monitors for use in the education workshops for school groups throughout the year. 30,000 students per annum attend a variety of workshops which cover science and engineering, innovation and invention, digital technologies, social sciences and transport. Napier Group Riding for the Disabled Association Incorporated	\$20,679.84	Funding for: (1) replacement computers used for client records, documenting horse care and training, undertaking research, maintaining health and safety documentation, (2) horse feed and supplements, (3) veterinary care, farriers and dentists, (4) equipment including saddles, covers and helmets. Panacea Arts Charitable Trust (trading as Mapura Studios)	\$8,960.00	Funding for tutors for the Creative Therapy Youth (aged 12-25) and Creative Therapy Kids (aged 5 - 13) programmes aimed at young people who are on the Autism spectrum.	Auckland
Road Safety Education Limited	\$9,940.88	Funding towards the purchase of four presentation laptops for the Northland and Central North Island regional facilitator team and towards the salary of their National Manager/Auckland Programme Coordinator. The programme educates students to assess risks and communicate responsibilities when they are using the road.	Auckland
South Island Kokako Charitable Trust	\$10,130.00	Funding towards efforts to conserve the South Island kokako. Costs are (1) Project Manager wages to extend time on project promotion and development, including raising awareness of the plight of the South Island kokako, (2) volunteer support i.e. fuel and food vouchers, (3) specialist detection equipment - mini trail cameras and the SD cards and batteries to go with them. Stepping Stone Trust	\$25,000.00	Funding towards the cost of providing camps, equipment, recreational activities, educational and training programmes, workshops, mentoring and counselling for traumatised youth.	Christchurch
Tauranga Living Without Violence Collective Trust	\$10,000.00	Funding to develop content for a life skills workshop for perpetrators of violence. This is a one-on-one mentoring service that will cater to marginalised and vulnerable youth. The CanInspire Charitable Trust	\$4,440.00	Funding for 12 CanBead workshops nationwide. These workshops are free for all people experiencing illness, trauma or personal loss. Attendees are taught jewellery-making skills and are given a kit with tools, materials and beads so they can continue to create jewellery pieces whenever they need distraction from their treatment or in times of stress. The Girl Guides Association New Zealand Incorporated	\$5,000.00	Funding towards events and/or gatherings taking place around the country to support volunteers who provide girls with opportunities for adventure and social action. The aim is to provide volunteers with a sense of connection, community, whanau and fellowship, which helps with volunteer retention.	Christchurch
The Lifewise Trust	\$24,400.00	Funding for mental health and resilience for two groups: (1) 20 highly at-risk 16 - 24 year olds and, (2) 60 marginalised adults who require housing support, connection and resilience building. These people have been badly affected by Covid-19, their lack of employable skills/resources to recover and mental health is exacerbated by addictions.	Auckland
Waikato Family Centre Trust	\$8,370.00	Funding to support mothers and their families in their wellbeing and health via holistic health and wellbeing education and support. Qualified health and wellbeing practitioners that have existing knowledge, experience and understanding of the needs of mothers are utilised to run these courses.	Hamilton

Well Women and Family Trust	\$9,999.00	Funding towards qualified life coaches to assist women to achieve economic and social independence by providing learning opportunities that will prepare them for meaningful work and improved quality of life.	Auckland
Wellington down Syndrome Social Club - Charitable Trust	\$5,000.00	Funding for the annual overnight camp for young adults with Down Syndrome. The attendees love the camp, as they have very few opportunities for these sorts of social activities. The camp, and the club, are an important part of their lives.	Wellington
Wellington Homeless Women's Trust	\$8,000.00	Funding for a physical and mental wellbeing programme for homeless women in Wellington called WALK. Part of the Funding will enable the purchase of the appropriate gear for each of the women to participate in the programme. The objective is to get these women focused on loving themselves again and becoming physically and mentally well. Most of these women have very little in the way of personal possessions.	Wellington
West Coast Penguin Trust	\$8,940.00	Funding towards education programmes working with schools across the West Coast to introduce and then support teachers to use the education resources, Blue Penguins and Other Seabirds. This provides children with an understanding of and appreciation for the local penguins and other threatened seabirds, and to take action to help protect them.	Hokitika
Whangarei Repertory Society Incorporated	\$24,264.81	Funding for a new air conditioning unit for the theatre. This is essential for future productions. Heat from the stage lights builds up progressively and the auditorium and stage become extremely uncomfortable for patrons, cast and crew. The current unit is 15 years old and is not functioning effectively.	Whangarei

Wrapped Charitable trust	\$4,000.00	Funding to provide 10 quilts and 10 bags per month to disadvantaged children in the East Coast area that are going into care. This is to give the children something that they own and an emotional moment knowing that someone has made these especially for them.	Napier
Youth Encounter Ministries Trust	\$9,000.00	Funding towards the Therapy and Youth Mentoring programmes. Young people are referred by Oranga Tamariki, Youth Justice, police, schools and whanau asking for help. Since Covid-19, there has been an increase in demand for services and troubled youth with more complex issues including anxiety, feelings of hopelessness, depression, suicidal thoughts and non-engagement with schooling.
