ANZ Investments Multi-Asset-Class Scheme (marketed as the ANZ Investment Funds)

Conservative Balanced Fund

What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Conservative Balanced Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. ANZ New Zealand Investments Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

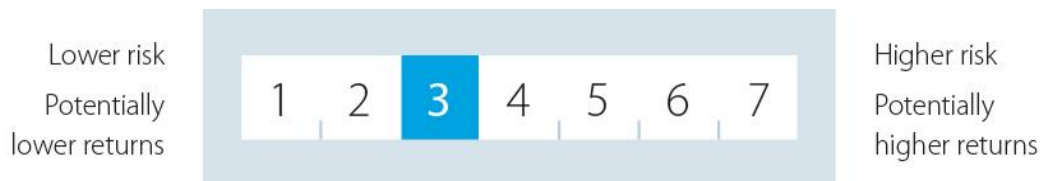
The Conservative Balanced Fund invests mainly in income assets (cash and cash equivalents and fixed interest), with some exposure to growth assets (equities and listed property). The fund may also invest in alternative assets.

The fund aims to achieve a positive yearly return (after the fund charge and before tax) that over the long-term is 2.2% over inflation (allowing for a negative return 4.0 years in every 20).

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Conservative Balanced Fund:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

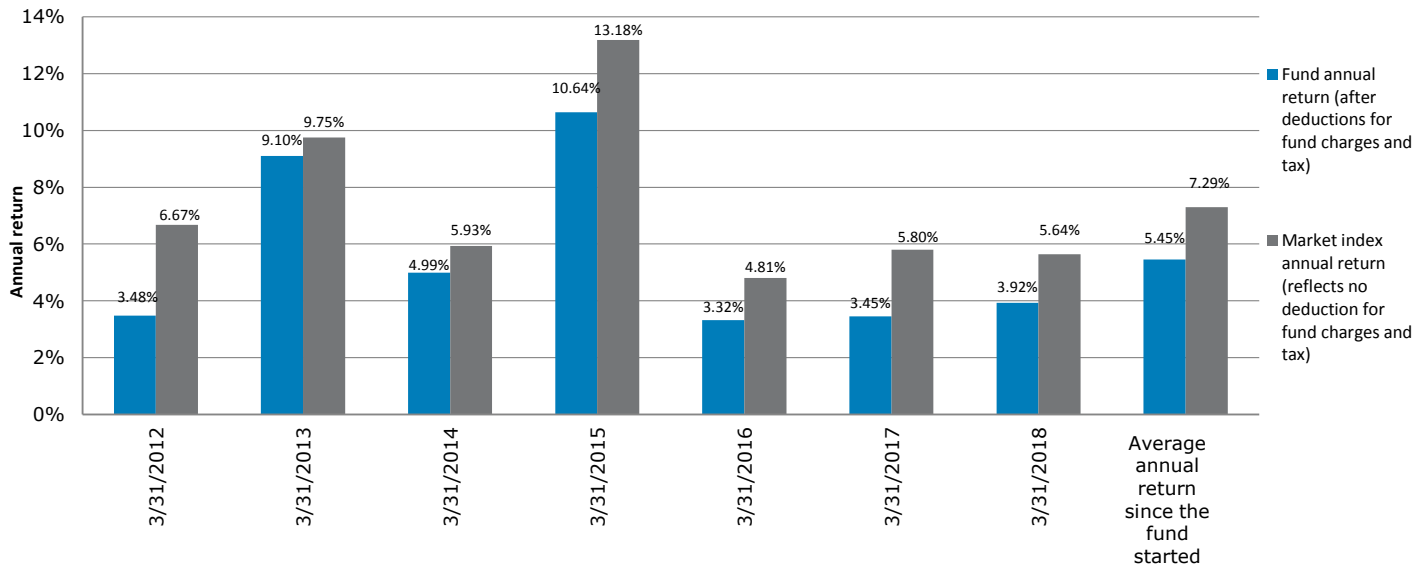
How has the fund performed?

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Example of how this applies to an investor

Sarah had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Sarah received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$517 (that is 5.17% of her initial \$10,000). Sarah did not pay any other charges. This gives Sarah a total return after tax of \$517 for the year.

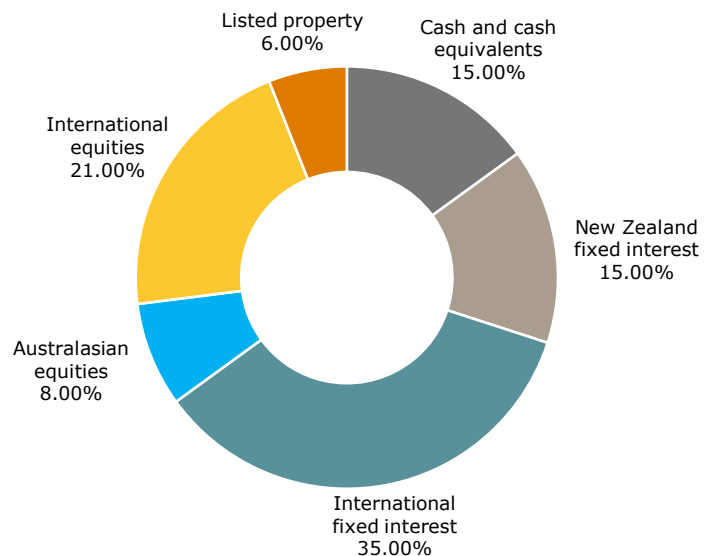
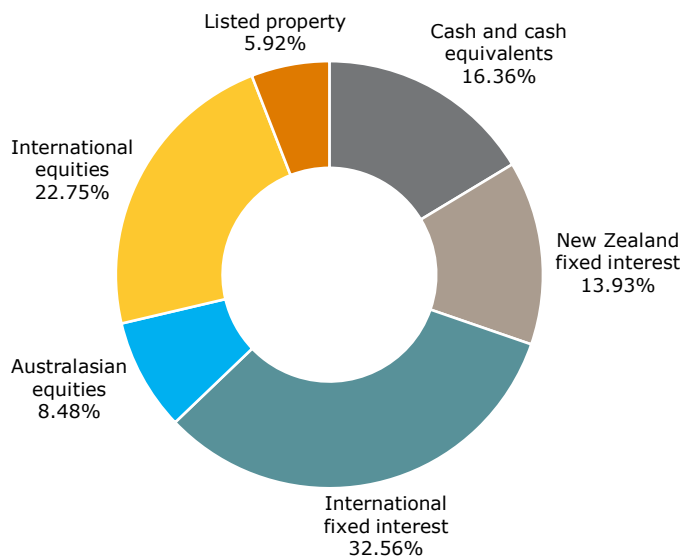
What does the fund invest in?
