What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Sustainable International Share Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. ANZ New Zealand Investments Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The Sustainable International Share Fund invests mainly in equities in companies pursuing a sustainable development policy. Investments may include:

- equities in companies pursuing a sustainable development policy and combining respect for social principles (such as human rights, non-discrimination and the issue of child labour) and environmental principles, with good financial prospects,
- convertible securities, and
- cash and cash equivalents.

The fund aims to achieve a positive yearly return (after the fund charge and before tax) that over the long-term outperforms the relevant market index.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Sustainable International Share Fund:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.



Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Example of how this applies to an investor

Sarah had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Sarah received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$2,465 (that is 24.65% of her initial \$10,000). Sarah also paid \$18 in other charges. This gives Sarah a total gain after tax of \$2,447 for the year.




Actual investment mix³

If you're invested in more than one fund, this fee will be deducted from the fund with the highest balance.
