

# ANZ INVESTMENTS SINGLE-ASSET-CLASS SCHEME (marketed as the OneAnswer Single-Asset-Class Funds) AUSTRALIAN SHARE FUND

## WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THIS UPDATE?

This document tells you how the Australian Share Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. ANZ New Zealand Investments Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

## DESCRIPTION OF THIS FUND

The Australian Share Fund invests mainly in Australian equities. Investments may include equities in companies that are listed or are soon to be listed on the Australian stock exchange, and cash and cash equivalents.

The fund aims to achieve a positive yearly return (after the fund charge and before tax) that over the long-term outperforms the relevant market index.

## WHAT ARE THE RISKS OF INVESTING?

Risk indicator for the Australian Share Fund:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

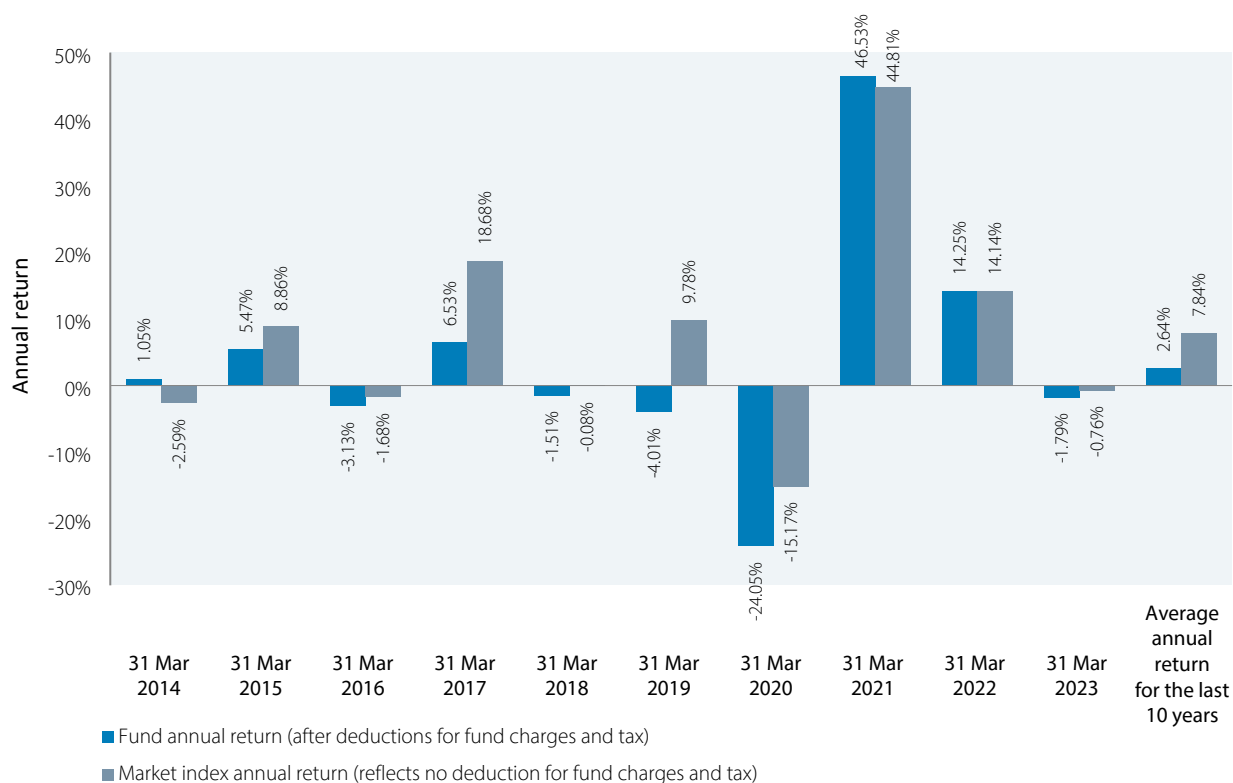

\*The manager expects that the fund charges for the next scheme year will be less than the fund charges disclosed in this fund update because the manager's basic fee was reduced effective 3 August 2023 from 1.00% to 0.95% per year.

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

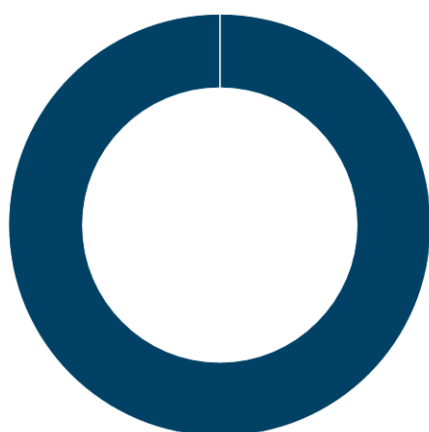
### EXAMPLE OF HOW THIS APPLIES TO AN INVESTOR

Sarah had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Sarah received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$443 (that is 4.43% of her initial \$10,000). Sarah did not pay any other charges. This gives Sarah a total return after tax of \$443 for the year.

### Actual investment mix<sup>2</sup>

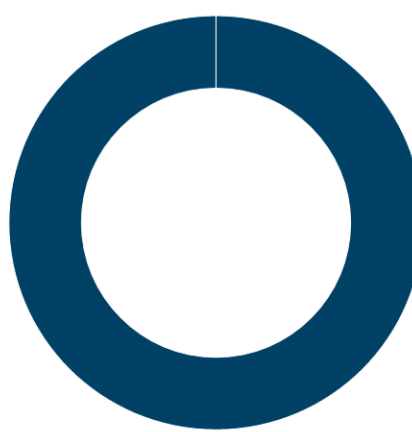
This shows the types of assets that the fund invests in.
