What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Australian Share Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Description of this fund

The Australian Share Fund invests mainly in Australian equities. Investments may include:


- equities in companies that are listed or in the process of listing on the Australian stock exchange, and
- cash and cash equivalents.

The fund aims to achieve a positive yearly return (after the fund charge and before tax) that over the long-term outperforms the relevant market index.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Australian Share Fund:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.




Example of how this applies to an investor

Sarah had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Sarah incurred a loss after fund charges were deducted of \$151 (that is -1.51% of her initial \$10,000). Sarah did not pay any other charges. This gives Sarah a total loss after tax of \$151 for the year.


Actual investment mix¹
